Secretary Minutes from July 15, 2017 General Meeting

It was moved, seconded and carried (MSC) that the June SVQG minutes, as published in the newsletter, be approved.

Bev London presented the treasurer's report.

Reports:

Hospitality. The August meeting will be a covered-dish picnic at Oakdale Park in Bridgewater, Va. Hot dogs and beverages will be provided. Members are asked to bring a side dish or dessert to share.

Raffle Quilt. Mary Carlton reported that Connie Broy is working on the quilt. It will be at the August picnic.

Service. Denise Rudolph reported that 16 patriotic quilts were collected for hospice and thanked the members. Two volunteers agreed to deliver the quilts to Augusta and Sentara hospitals. She read two thank-you cards received for a pillow and tote and a hospice quilt.

Sunshine. Sue Jones reported that seven birthday cards were sent. She sent a thank you note to a donor of fabric for service.

Virginia Quilt Museum. Josephine Millet told the members about a World War I symposium being held at the museum at the end of July. Information about the symposium is on the museum website.

At the June meeting Josephine was asked to find out when the museum can host a SVQG exhibit. The guild is on the calendar for June, 2019. The exhibit will hang for six months (June to December) and the museum will work with the guild on the specifics of their requirements for the exhibit.

Announcements:

Old Business:

The members voted on proposals for sharing the proceeds of the 2018 Raffle Quilt. Doreen read the four proposals presented at the June guild meeting, and she and Phyllis Hollowell counted and verified the vote. A decisive majority (22) approved the proposal as follows:

<u>Guild members will sell the raffle tickets.</u> Once the profits (less expenses) are known, the guild will decide and vote on the donation we want to make and which organization or organizations will be the recipients.

The board has approved a change in the price of raffle tickets for 2018. They will cost \$2 each or sold in sets of three tickets for \$5.

In other old business, SVQG membership is running a contest through September. The first six members who invite a friend to a guild meeting, and that friend joins the guild, will receive one free entry ticket to the Sewing and Quilt Expo October 5, 6, 7 at the Fredericksburg Expo Center.
