Minutes for General Meeting
May 16, 2015

The general meeting was call to order by Molly Toth, guild president.

There was one visitor today and she also became a new member. Molly read a thank you card from VMRC thanking the guild for the quilt show held there for part of April and May. Molly announced that there are several quilt shows coming up and the information is on the back table for those that are interested.

The general meeting minutes for April 2015 were approved as printed in the newsletter on a motion from Dianne Reasons and seconded by Liz Adams.

The treasurer's report was read and the ending balance was \$10,708.21. Nancy Harris co-treasurer read the additions to the proposed budget for 2015 which were \$120 for hospitality and \$300 for expenses for the 2016 raffle quilt. Nancy answered questions from the members about the proposed budget and Liz Adams moved that the additions to the budget be approved and Dianne Reasons seconded. There was additional discussion and questions made about the amount allotted for programs and Amy Sirocky-Meck answered questions and spoke about the expenses involved. After more discussion Lori Abbott-Herrick made a motion to approve the 2015 budget and Dianne Reasons seconded. The general membership voted to approve the budget.

Nancy Harris co-treasurer suggested to the membership that the date of membership renewal and the fiscal year be the same. This would mean that they would both run February 1st - January 31st the following year. The board will need to discuss this further. Nancy also suggested that the budget be bi-annual instead of annual to include the quilt show and its income and expenses. This too will be discussed by the board members.

Nina Jackson, president elect announced that there are still three positions that need to be filled for next year. That includes: treasurer, president elect, and program coordinator. It would also be helpful to have a second person to help with hospitality.

Denise Rudolph, service coordinator announced that there were 34 comfort pillows and totes brought in today and they will be delivered to Augusta Health. There are kits here on the back table for comfort pillows and hospice quilts to be finished. Denice read a thank you note from Sentara hospice for the quilts donated to them.

PHD project #4 is due today and #6 is due at the July meeting.

Quilt show 2016 will be held at Turner Ashby high school on June 25-26, 2016. The suggested title of the show is "Threads That Bind Us, 30 Years of Quilting Together". Denise has asked that the past presidents of the guild display their president's quilts in the show.

Newsletter articles are due May 22, 2015.

Programs: Amy Sirocky-Meck announced that Josephine Millett will lead a class in back basted applique this afternoon. At the June meeting Lori Schrock will lead us in some gentle stretches for the morning program and Mary Carlton will have a mystery quilt class in the afternoon. (These classes are always fun.) In July Diane Norman will talk about quilt documentation in the morning and will teach a class in hand piecing in the afternoon.

Amy asked the membership for the funds to purchase a projector for the speakers to use during programs. The estimated cost is \$300. Dianne Reasons made a motion to purchase the projector and Liz Adams seconded.

Sunshine: Three birthday cards were sent out and one thinking of you block was sent.

Josephine Millett announced that Dorothy Peterson's husband died.

Kathy Christy talked about the retreat that was held last month at Hat Creek Camp. There were 18 present and a wonderful time was had by all.

Raffle quilt: Jan Hood announced that the last block was turned in today and that she hopes to have the quilt at the meeting in June for all to see. Jan is looking into purchasing blank tickets that can be printed for less.

Barbara Cline announced some workshops that she and her sister will be leading at their home place in Bridgewater. There was info about this in the April newsletter.

After a wonderful program about applique by Josephine Millett and all the beautiful quilts that she showed during her presentation the meeting was adjourned.

The following recipes are those shared from our 2015 retreat. Yummy!!!

Chocolate Scottish Cake -

2 cups flour	½ cup buttermilk
2 cups sugar	1 tsp. baking soda
1 stick butter	2 eggs
½ cup shortening	1 tsp. cinnamon
4 Tbsp. cocoa	1 tsp. vanilla
1 cup hot water	

In 3-quart saucepan combine butter, shortening, cocoa and water and bring to a boil. Mix flour and sugar and stir into pan. Add buttermilk mixed with soda. Add eggs, cinnamon and vanilla, mixing well. Bake in greased 9 x 13" pan for 30 minutes at 350 degrees.

Icing -

1 stick butter
6 Tbsp. milk
4 Tbsp. cocoa
1 box powdered sugar
1 cup chopped pecans
1 cup coconut

Combine butter, milk and cocoa. Bring to a boil. Remove from heat and stir in remaining ingredients. Pour over warm cake.

White chocolate covered pretzels and peanuts -

18 ounces white almond bark or candy coating melted. (I make a double boiler out of a large Dutch oven and a stainless steel mixing bowl) There are usually microwave directions on the package but I have not tried that. **DO NOT USE WHITE CHOCOLATE CHIPS** they do not melt well and cost too much.

2 cups dry roasted peanuts unsalted
3 cups broken thin pretzel sticks

After the chocolate is melted remove from the double boiler and add the peanuts and pretzels. Stir so that all ingredients are covered with chocolate. Pour mixture onto a lightly greased jelly roll pan and spread out. Place in refrigerator until hardened (approx. 15 minutes)
Once hard break up into pieces. Store in sealable container. ENJOY

The finished quilt will be 48 inches square before borders...and the borders will be up to you!

- 3 yards total of medium and dark fabrics

Cutting Instructions: Complete your cutting before the workshop

288 total 2 and ½ inch x 2 and ½ inch squares: Half made with **dark** fabrics and half with **medium** fabrics

144 total 2 and 7/8 inch x 2 and 7/8 inch squares: **Dark** fabric

72 total 4 and ½ inch x 4 and ½ inch squares: **Light** fabric

Sewing Supplies:

- Sewing machine in good working order (extension cord in good condition also recommended)
- Iron and Ironing mat
- Regular sewing supplies and notions


