## Service

Sue Jones delivered about thirty pillows/totes to Augusta Health after the February meeting and I delivered six large dog pillows to the Winchester shelter this week.

In March we will have representatives from Augusta Health, Sentara and Blue Ridge Hospice speak about the lap quilts we donate. We will be collecting quilts that day to send back with these groups. Last year we sent them home with 82 quilts!!!! Let's see if we can top that!!! I have a lot of quilts all over my service room at home and I can't wait to load up the car in March and bring them to distribute.

**For the afternoon session – Let's think spring!!!! I would like to get a donation of 12" fabric blocks (this is the size you would cut). I am looking for flower prints; bright, solid fabrics and green for leaves. We will need 20 for each lap quilt. Please bring a square or two to brighten someone's day! We will also be working on other service projects – dog pillows and breast cancer totes/pillows. We have a variety of things we will be working on so bring your machine, cutting board, scissors, iron, thread, and lunch and join in on the fun!!**

ALMOND SQUARES (Josephine Millett)

12 Graham Crackers (5 x 2-1/2)

¾ cup of Butter – (1-1/2 sticks) No substitute – cut up in chunks.

½ cup sugar

1 cup sliced almonds

Pre-heat oven to 350 degrees.

Place Graham Crackers side by side in ungreased 15-1/2 x 10-1/2

Jellyroll Pan (make sure to use pan size called for.) Crackers

should cover entire pan without any spaces in between.

In a one-quart sauce- pan, combine butter and sugar: heat to

boiling over medium low heat; stirring constantly. Boil 2 minutes

until mixture thickens slightly. Spread mixture over graham

crackers; spread almonds. Bake 12-15 minutes until browned slightly and butter bubbles. (Watch that it does not burn,)

Immediately cut (while still in pan) using metal spatula and transfer to wire rack to cool.

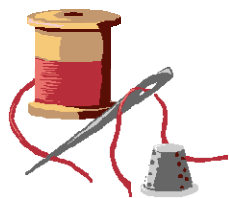

WHAT IS A BOUTIQUE? – The dictionary says it’s a small retail shop that specializes in gifts! A feature of SVQG’s quilt show has always been the Boutique; a place to sell items that Quilt Guild members and their family have made.

I’m Josephine Millett and once again I will be running the Boutique at the show. I will be selling your items for you, (the guild will keep only 15%)...what a deal. The thing that you, the guild member have to do, is bring them to me on Friday, June 24th when we are setting up the show. Please make a list of the items that you bring, and what they are to sell for.

I’ll take care of all of the rest. Some guild members donate all of the sales of their items to the Guild. That is your decision.

What I have found over the years taking care of the Quilt Show Boutique is --- the items that sell the best are items that a Quilter would not generally make themselves. Also unique, cute things and items that will make good gifts.

If you have a quilt that you are going to hang in the show, and want to sell it, I’ll take care of that for you too. Just decide what price you want. When you turn in your form for the quilt, be sure to indicate that it is for sale. Make sure that it gets a sign placed on it indicating it is for sale. Let me know the price you are asking. The potential buyer is to be referred to the Boutique to close the sale. (Once again, the Guild will keep 15%) This year our customers will be able to charge their purchases. After the show on Sunday, unsold items will be returned to you.

I’m looking forward to having loads of unique gift items to sell in the Boutique. Get Busy!

**SVQG QUILT SHOW RULES**

1. All entry forms (either mailed or emailed) must be received by Denise Rudolph, 2456 S. Pifer Road, Star Tannery, VA 22654 by **May 1, 2016**.
2. Each entry (quilt or other item) must be labeled on the lower right back corner. Label must contain – Name of entry and Exhibitor’s name, address, and phone number.
3. A quilt is “show ready” when it is completely finished and has a **4” quilt sleeve sewn** to the top of the back of ALL quilts 48” wide or larger (except clothing and accessories). A quilt without the required sleeve for hanging cannot be included in the show.
4. The quilt show committee reserves the right to place entries in a category other than the one for which it was entered. Entries will be arranged the Quilt Show Committee.
5. A receipt will be given to you at the time the quilt or item is accepted for entry in the show. Your receipt will be required to pick up the quilt or item Sunday, June 26, 2016 after the close of the show.
6. Quilts entered in the show that are for sale must be indicated on the entry form with the price. We will include “For Sale” on your quilt description. The buyer will contact the Boutique for sale details. The purchased quilt will remain on display until the end of the show. The seller will pick up the quilt and make arrangements to deliver it to the purchaser.
7. Please include a picture of your quilt with the registration to assist when planning quilt placement in the show.
8. Only current members of the SVQG can exhibit in the show.

I understand that SVQG will take every precaution in the care and handling of my quilt and I will not hold the group responsible for any loss or damage to my entry due to unforeseen events that may occur. Entrants are responsible for insuring their own entries. I acknowledge the rules and will abide by them.
