## Secretary Minutes from October 15, 2016 General Meeting

President Sandie Hammel called the October meeting of the Shenandoah Valley Quilters Guild (SVQG) to order at 9:30 a.m. Forty-three members and guests were present, including the guest speaker, Gwyn Campbell. Sandie asked new members to stand and introduce themselves with a short biography.

- It was moved, seconded and carried (MSC) that the September SVQG minutes, as published in the newsletter, be approved.
- In the absence of the treasurer, Sandie presented the treasurer's report.
- Sandie reminded those members with November birthdays to bring refreshments to the meeting next month.
- Members are encouraged to use the guild library. A portion of the collection is brought to guild meetings, and the entire library catalog is available on the guild website. If you e-mail the librarian, the book(s) that you request will be brought to the next meeting.
- Sandie made an official announcement that the board has approved increasing the yearly dues (including emailed newsletters) from \$20/year to \$25/year starting with the February 1, 2017 through January 31, 2018 membership year. If a member requests that their newsletter be sent via the postal service, the fee will be an additional \$15/year. This announcement will be posted in the November newsletter and voted on by the membership at the November 19th guild meeting.

### Committee Reports:

- The newsletter deadline is October 21 st .
- Barbara Cline, program chair, announced that the workshop held Friday, October 14 with Gwyn Campbell was very informative and fun. She has several patterns still available at a discounted cost. The workshop in October, taught by guild member Liz Adams, will be a mother/ daughter (granddaughter or friend) workshop making zipper pouches. Members are encouraged to come and bring a guest, or just to come to learn to make zipper pouches. The program at the meeting, with Barbara Cline as speaker, will be about value and color.
- Denise Rudolph, service chair, announced that she received sixty-three pillows and totes for breast cancer patients today. Next month she will be collecting hospice quilts. She read a letter from a family of a patient who had received one of the hospice quilts, thanking the guild for their kindness.
- The sunshine chair, Sue Jones, reported that seven birthday blocks and three thinking-of- you blocks were mailed.
- Josephine Millet reported for Cerise Haas, Ways and Means chair, that there is a raffle quilt basket available. Cheryl Hawes is the vendor of the day, and there are a wide variety of items available. Members are encouraged to support the vendors at the meetings. Ten percent of their sales for the day go back to the guild treasury. If a member wants to reserve a vendor table, they should contact Cerise Haas.
- Josephine also updated the members about the new show at the Virginia Quilt Museum, "Things that Go Bump in the Night". The exhibit features mourning quilts. October 21-22 there will be textile study seminars on "Mourning and Meaning through Cloth". For information, check the museum website. The secondary displays at the museum feature crazy quilts and a display from the Floyd County Quilt Guild.

New Business:

- There is an opportunity for the guild to have a display at the Virginia Quilt Museum and in order to get on the museum calendar for 2018, the guild would have to request this soon. One suggestion has been to feature the ribbon-winning quilts from the 2018 guild quilt show. However, Sandie reported that no one has volunteered to serve as chair or co-chair of the 2018 show. Two members have agreed to serve in an advisory role on the show committee. She asked the members who want the guild to have a show in 2018 to raise their hands. She challenged those with their hands up to decide among themselves who would be the right individuals to serve as chair and co-chair. Without this leadership, the show cannot go forward.
- In other business, the new wireless microphone system has arrived, and once Sandie has had a chance to master it, she will bring it to the meetings.
- An attorney has reviewed the partnership services agreement, outlining the agreement between the guild and partners we choose to work with for our raffle quilts. The board will vote on this agreement at the November 1st board meeting and the agreement will be posted on the bulletin board in November, and a copy placed in the Ways and Means chairperson's notebook. This agreement does not require a vote from the membership.
- A committee to review the guild bylaws, consisting of Jane Crockett, chair, Doreen Roadcap (Sandie Hammel, substituting), Jude McLaughlin, Joyce Aigner, and Beryl Lawson (John Hammel, substituting) met on October 4. Revisions to the bylaws are needed for clarity and to synchronize tax, membership and board/chair year. Sandie read the proposed revisions to the members, which are posted on the guild bulletin board for member review. A vote on the by-law revisions is scheduled for the November 19th meeting. A final, approved copy will be attached to the November newsletter.
- Kathy Christie and Jane Crockett are working on the plans for a retreat for guild members next spring. It is planned for April 23rd through April 26 (Sunday through Wednesday) at Shrine Mont, Orkney Springs, Va. The room rate includes dinner Sunday through lunch Wednesday. Participants will be asked for a \$50 non-refundable deposit for the retreat at the January guild meeting. There was a request that day participants (with a charge for lunch and table set-up) be allowed. A sign-up sheet was passed.
- The traveling basket was won by Phyllis Hollowell.
- Kathy Christy gave a block demonstration of a modern "Wonky X" block made with 10-inch squares.
- After show and tell and a break for refreshments, a drawing for the raffle was won by Gae Baker. Gwyn Campbell, Judy Neimeyer certified instructor, gave a lecture and presented a trunk show of her work.

There being no further business, the meeting was adjourned.

## Program - November

### Wide-Open Zipper Pouch Supply List By Liz Adams

All sizes require the following pieces: 2 lining, 2 batting, and 2 exterior pieces.

If you want the exterior to have two different fabrics, cut two from each measurement below. Lining and batting sizes remain the same.

Zipper tab: a 2" x 3" piece of either exterior or lining fabric

Pouch Size	Fabric & Batting	Zipper Size	Corner Square Size	Two Color Exterior
Small	7" x 10"	10"	1"	3.5" x 10" 4.5" x 10"
Medium	9" x 12"	12"	1.5"	4.5" x 12" 5.5" x 12"
Large	11" x 14"	14"	2"	5.5" x 14" 6.5" x 14"

### Three Pocket Purse Supply List

One 18" square of quilted fabric. You may make your own or purchase pre-quilted fabric. If you make your own start out with a 19" square and cut it down after quilting.

Binding fabric: 2.5" wide and enough to bind all four sides of the square.

Handle fabric: can be the same as the binding or can be braided silky cord (which I prefer).



## Announcements

- Board Meeting - The next Board Meeting will be on November 1, 2016 from 1 to 3 p.m. at North River Library, 118 Mount Crawford Ave, Bridgewater.
- Quilt Show 2018 Needs Leadership - We are looking for two volunteers to serve as Quilt Show 2018 Chairman and Co-Chairman. Two friends who work well together would be ideal. Remember there is help from those who have done this in the past. Denise Rudolph your advisor and Doreen Roadcap who will be serving as President during this quilt show year will be there to help. We need to secure the venue for this event well ahead so help is needed as soon as possible.
- Ballot Vote for your 2018 Quilt Show - The show of hands in October for wanting to produce a quilt show in 2018 was lower than should have been. The lack of enthusiasm for volunteers to fill the positions of Chairman and Co-chairman for the show tell me that we need to find out why. To get a true over view of what the guild wants there will be ballots at the membership table for you to fill in at the November meeting. It is important to your Board to hear your thoughts.
- Increase in Dues - The Board from 2015-2016 had announced that an increase in dues was needed to keep the guild running smoothly. Your 2016-2017 Board voted to make this increase starting in the new February 1, 2017 - January 31, 2018 membership year. The dues will be increased to \$25.00 (from \$20.00) for membership with emailed newsletters. For those who want to have their newsletters mailed via U.S. Postal Service there would be an additional fee of \$15.00 (from \$12.00).
