
Ways and Means

BEE News

The Eager BEEver continue to make service quilts to support Wrap-A-Smile and A Small Hand programs. In October Fran Miller took a road trip to Maine and met up with Terry Hodskins, coordinator of quilts for Rotary's WAS program. With this road trip in mind, we worked hard to be able to send along a trunk full of quilts. We finished 81 quilts from the Eager BEEver, along with a quilt from Jane Crockett and one from Vicki Graham. Terry was, to say the least, overwhelmed with the number of quilts and so appreciated them. These quilts used lots of fabric and batting plus many hours of sewing and quilting since our last shipment to WAS 18 months ago!

We had also planned to make a fall delivery of quilts to A Small Hand, an infant pantry in Edinburg, but learned from Ann McBroom, director, that ASH may need to close by the end of this year in order to re-evaluate the program. The need is greater than ever but the volunteer base is aging and more help is needed to keep the program running.

Ann then told us about a mother and two small girls who lost everything, including the Dad and husband, when their home recently burned. We quickly sewed and quilted a bed quilt for the mother, a twin quilt for the oldest daughter and a crib quilt for the toddler. About two weeks ago the quilts were delivered personally to Ann and the family, and we saw first-hand the mother's appreciation and gratification for the gifts of love and warmth from us.

We continue our commitment to use our gifts and talents to assist those in need.
