# Shenandoah Valley Quilters Guild General Meeting July 19, 2014

The general meeting was called to order at 9:30am by Vicki Graham. We had two visitors and one new member today.

The general meeting minutes from June 2014 were approved as printed in the newsletter on a motion by Liz Adams, seconded by Molly Toth.

The Treasurer's Report had an ending balance of \$15,016.90 including a CD. The report was approved by the board and will be filed as reported and on the website. Cerise also reported that raffle ticket sales to date amounted to \$2,020 and expenses were \$755 (fabric purchase, quilting and printing tickets). This does not include money from the Shenandoah Valley Children's Choir.

Announcements: Vicki received two thank you cards, one from Josephine Millett and the other from the VA Quilt Museum, for our donation to the quilt museum. Vicki also reported that the quilt museum is looking for quilts to display made by men in Virginia. The quilts will be juried. Election of Officers for 2014-2015: Molly Toth presented the rest of her board for approval. For treasurer, Nancy Harris and Lou Emswiler will share the duties of Treasurer, and Nina Jackson has agreed to be President –Elect. The motion was made to accept these members for their respective position by Liz Adams and seconded by Gail Oliver. Motion approved.

#### Minutes for July General Meeting - continued

Program Coordinator #1: A sample of today's workshop by Deborah Schupp was shown.

Service: Denise distributed 90 quilts to area hospices and the Winchester group for their foster children camp. She also had Samantha Dolls for members to take and make the doll a small quilt and a matching lap quilt. Denise said that the dolls were helping patients with dementia. Since August 2013 to present, our guild has made 179 quilts for hospice.

August Picnic: The theme for the picnic is the 1950's. Get out your poodle skirt and join us in Bridgewater at pavilion No. 1. Hot dogs, hamburgers and root beer floats will be provided. Bring a covered dish to share.

Sunshine: Sue sent 6 birthday cards and 4 TOY blocks.

Hospitality: Today's hostesses are Gail Oliver and Barbara Cline.

Newsletter: The deadline for the newsletter is Friday, July 25 by noon. Sandi asked that the articles should be complete and spell checked before sending them.

Final Quilt Show Update: Bev London thanked everyone for helping with the quilt show. She said that there were good comments from everyone including the vendors. We had 433 paying visitors to the show. A final accounting will be given at the August meeting.

Raffle Quilt: The board made a recommendation as to how the net proceeds of the raffle quilt income should be divided. The motion to match the amount the Shenandoah Valley Children's Choir raised for the quilt was made by Molly Toth and seconded by Liz Adams. At this time the amount from the choir is only approximate (\$436). With a show of hands, the vote on the motion was 32 for and 2 against. In addition, the board asked the members how we should go forward with raffle quilts. After much discussion, it was decided to put a survey in the next newsletter to help us decide several questions: Do we want to do another raffle quilt? If so do we want to partner with an organization? After the break, three people said they would head up a committee regarding the next raffle quilt – Jan Hood, Mary Carlton and Gloria Wegman.

By-Laws Vote: The revised By-laws were printed in the July newsletter and updated on the website. A motion was made by Liz Adams and seconded by Molly Toth to accept the revised by-laws as submitted. After discussion of what the changes entailed, including taking out the procedures and policies, the motion passed by hand vote.

Following a break, the drawing for the **raffle quilts** was held. The **winner was Gary Morris of Shenandoah.**

Show and Tell followed the break. Dianne introduced Deborah Schupp who presented a lecture on value with many examples of how value changed the look of the same block.

Sign-up sheets for 2014-2015 PHD (Projects Half Done) Program are on the table in the back. Completed forms and two fat quarters are due by the September meeting to Diana Norman. The last UFO to complete by September is number 4.

The meeting adjourned at 11:45am.
