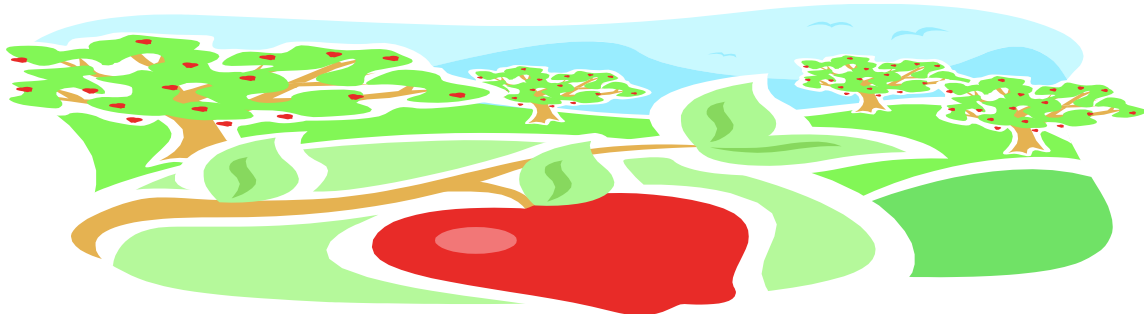
Vicki will transfer all the President's info to me before the September meeting (she is hoping it will do me some good --we will see) so we will go on from there.

General Meeting
August 16, 2014**

The general meeting was called to order at 9:45 am by Vicki Graham who welcomed everyone to the annual picnic in Oakdale Park, Bridgewater. The theme for the picnic was the 1950's. Many were dressed in clothes reminiscent of the times-- poodle skirts and polka dot dresses. We had one visitor attending our annual picnic. Vicki announced that Molly Toth's husband had surgery, Lori Abbott-Herrick's new grandson arrived on Thursday, and many SVQG members won ribbons at the Rockingham County Fair.

The general meeting minutes from June 2014 were approved as printed in the newsletter on a motion by Carolyn Purdy, seconded by Dorice Graham.

The Treasurer's Report will be approved at the next regular meeting in September. Vicki asked if anyone had computer experience to assist with our website. Our host company has issues that prohibit uploading files to our website. Nancy Harris will get with Dianne Reasons to secure another website provider.

Although we have technically completed our 2013-2014 UFO Challenge, that doesn't mean to put your final UFO away for some other time. You are still encouraged to complete it for show and tell at the September guild meeting! At our meeting/picnic in August, we drew the winner's name for the "Mountain of Fat Quarters" grand prize. Congratulations, Sandie Hammel! And congratulations to everyone who participated in this past year's challenge--you are ALL winners! It has been another fun-tastic year with awesome quilts for show & tell!

As you know by now, beginning in September, you can join us at the "**Shenandoah Valley Quilters Guild Institute of Higher Education**". That's right--we are taking our UFOs to the next level. Guild members will be working on our "**PhDs**" during the 2014-2015 year-- "**Projects half Done**", that is! Using the PhD Sign-Up Sheet in this newsletter, list any 6 (fewer, if you don't have 6!!) projects that you want to complete in the coming 12 months (2 months to complete each project, selected randomly). OR you can just email your handwritten list of 6 projects to me at dnorman8816@comcast.net, then bring your 2 initial fat quarters to the meeting. Please include your preferred email address, if you send me your list from another address.

PLEASE NOTE: If you have participated in the UFO Challenge(s) previously but were not able to complete some particularly large or difficult projects, **go easy on yourself this time**--spread out larger projects over 2 or 3 periods (of 2 months each). Don't try to complete an entire quilt in a two-month period! For example, you may list one project for 2 or 3 two-month periods like this: 1) Complete blocks for "XYZ Quilt"; 2) Put "XYZ Quilt" top together; and 3) Quilt "XYZ Quilt".

If you aren't sure how this program works already, send me an email!

We already have 10 firm participants, with a few more promises. Join us!

Fabric (*sample uses blues and greens*):

- ½ yard of a print fabric with 2 main hues (*blues and greens recommended*)
- ½ yard of a solid color or toned fabric to compliment print fabric (*blue recommended*)
- ½ yard of another solid color or toned fabric to compliment print fabric (*green recommended*)
- Background fabric: 1 yard

Additional Supplies:

- 1 sheet of template plastic
- 1 and a 1/2 yards double sided fusible web (such as Light Heat N Bond)
- ¼ yard black nylon netting or tulle 108" wide
- Creative Grids 60 degree ruler (*recommended*)
- Simply Triangles by Barbara Cline (not required; copies of pattern will be provided at workshop)

Sewing Supplies:

- Sewing machine in good working order (extension cord in good condition also recommended)
- Scissors
- Pins
- Sewing thread
- Seam ripper
- Rotary mat
- Rotary Ruler
- Rotary cutter
- Pencil
- Small iron and ironing mat (*recommended*)

- ¼ yard "sky" fabric
- ¼ yard "grass" fabric
- ¼ yard "rock" or "pebble" fabric
- ¼ yard small scale flower fabric
- 1 panel or 1 yard of "base fabric"
- Variety of fabrics in a variety of colors with elements such as houses, animals, lighthouses, cards, trees, bushes etc. of various size and scale

Additional Supplies:

- 1 foam core board for use as a portable design wall
- 1 yard fusible web (Heat N Bond recommended)
- 1 large glue stick
- 14"x20" piece of batting (Warm and Natural recommended)
- Colored pencils or markers

Sewing Supplies:

- Scissors
- Pins
- Scissors that can cut very small pieces of fabric
- Small iron and ironing mat/board
- Extension cord and power strip
- Basic sewing supplies
