

That was one fine program we had in July. Thanks to Sue for making all the arrangements.





### **COLOR INFORMATION**

This information was provided by Linda Lewis Taylor during the lecture:

Color has three properties.

1. Hue: Hue is color, the name of the color.
2. Value: Value is the light/darkness of a color.

Paints, cameras and most printers can reach a scale of light/dark numbered from one to ten. One being as dark as they can reach and ten being as light as they can get. The human eye is not so limited and we can see both darker and lighter things than we can reach with paint, cameras and print.

3. Chroma: Chroma is the intensity of color.

Chroma runs from a very grayed color to as saturated (intense or pure) as our printer, camera or paint can reach. Human color vision sees chroma in jumps of recognition. So color saturation goes in steps of two. Example, some red artists paints can reach a saturation of 18, and reading from gray would go 2, 4, 6, 8, 10, etc.

These terms are Albert Munsell's way of describing color.



**X-TREME X-BLOCKS** with Patricia Pepe

Patricia Pepe is a quilter and teacher from California. She developed the X-Block cutting tool and many patterns using it. She is the owner of Quilt Queen Designs. With the X-Block cutting tool, you can create dozens of spectacular designs that look complex, but are quick and simple. This class explores many of the design possibilities using the X-Block tool.
