Our focus will shift to those wounded troops who are working toward rehabilitation at the Woodrow Wilson Rehab Center in Fishersville, VA (midway between Staunton and Waynesboro). The center has an activity area for use by patients for "R & R" (rest and relaxation), after their day's sessions are complete. The center has undergone a renovation and the activity center is in need of several items. These include:

- Video Games
- Playing Cards Larger Size (easier to hold)
- CD's
