Minutes November 21, 2009

The meeting was called to order at 9:30 a.m. by President Barbara Linzey. Visitors were introduced. The minutes of the October meeting were read and approved.

The Treasurer's report showed a beginning balance of \$3,552.37; income of \$417.56; expenses of \$807.50; and a closing checkbook balance of \$3,162.43. With the CD of \$6,500.00 the guild has a total balance of \$9,662.43.

PROGRAM: Mary Carlton announced that the Christmas Party will be next month on December 12th at Sunnyside in our usual meeting room. Instead of gifts to exchange, bring canned goods for the Food Bank or a child's gift for the Toys for Tots campaign. Bring finger foods to enjoy, but not dessert, as this will be supplied.

The January Friday workshop will be a Victorian wreath. Sign-up forms are in the November/December Newsletter. Mary thanked everyone for the help given for the VCQ meeting which was a total success.

SECRET PAL: Today is the last day to sign up for secret pals. Presents for secret pals were handed out.

LIBRARY: Kathy reported on her trip to the Houston Quilt Show. She summarized the classes she attended. Her favorite class was by Patty Blair, who taught painting with inks on fabrics from pictures.
