


The afternoon activity will focus on our Service Project—making Breast Cancer Comfort Pillows and Totes for the local hospitals. For

years Sue Jones has managed this guild program and we are pleased to provide an opportunity for you to join her this year for an afternoon of fellowship and service. Elsewhere in this newsletter Sue will give more details about the kits provided and supplies for you to bring. We will have a group lunch with soups provided and we ask you to bring rolls, or cheese and crackers, or fruits. Tea, coffee, and water will be available.

Some of us have made pillows and totes through the years but this year we would like to spend some time to demonstrate the process (it really is simpler than reading the directions!) and pair the less-experienced with the more-experienced for the afternoon. SHENANDOAH VALLEY QUILTERS GUILD MEETING

Minutes - October 16, 2010

The meeting was called to order by President Sandie Hammel who welcomed everyone. She asked that committee reports be as short as possible since we have a busy morning. The minutes of the September meeting were approved as printed in the Newsletter. The Treasurer's Report was read and filed for audit.

PROGRAM: Fran Miller introduced Augusta Cole who will be presenting the program today. In November the director of the Virginia Quilt Museum will be presenting a lecture and a "shop" will be set up by Diane Reasons and Josephine Millett to sell items from the VQM store to benefit the museum. In the afternoon we will be making pillows and totes for the service project.

HOSPITALITY: Pauline Messier announced that we have a new coffeepot. She is serving decaf coffee today and hot water is available in the second pot. Please let her know if this is agreeable to you.

MEMBERSHIP: Sandie passed information from John that this is a good time of the year to invite friends to join. Dues are reduced after September and are not renewed until April 1st.

LIBRARY: Kathy Christy showed the 20 new books the guild has acquired; she announced that she would be going to Houston for the International Quilt Show. She asked members to let her know if there are specific types of books that they would like the guild to buy.

PUBLICITY: Lou Emswiler sent notification of the meeting to local newspapers in the Valley. Please let her know if an announcement is included in your local newspaper. She would appreciate a copy of the announcement.

SUNSHINE: Carolyn Shank happily said that only birthday cards were sent during the past month. Let her know of any other reason to send TOY cards.

WAYS AND MEANS: Door prizes were given out. There will be a raffle after break time and members were encouraged to buy raffle tickets.

Visitors were introduced and presented with gifts.

2012 QUILT SHOW: Connie Broy, Co-Chair, brought the new raffle quilt and asked everyone to bind five inches each. The quilt will go to the NQS Show and she asked members to think of a name for the quilt. A questionnaire was included in the Newsletter and she brought extra copies for those who forgot theirs.

QUILT MUSEUM: Josephine Millett mentioned that the exhibit at the Virginia Quilt Museum has changed. Barbara Cline's new book is for sale at the museum. Diane Reasons announced that the next Virginia Consortium of Quilters' meeting will be in Martinsville on November 13th. There will be a Quilt Show the evening before and classes and the meeting will be held at the Dutch Inn.

ROUND ROBIN: Mary Carlton announced that the next exchange for participants in the Round Robin will be in December. Two participants were not here today.

SERVICE: Sue Jones spoke about Breast Cancer Month (October). We have made 350 pillows and totes, our goal for the year. Next month we will be sewing and putting together pillows and totes for our service meeting. Last week 25 were donated to Augusta Health and Denise will take 50 to Winchester.

Anneka Dean from the American Cancer Society spoke about what they are doing and the services they provide to patients. In 2009 207,000 women and 1970 men were diagnosed with breast cancer. There is a 98% survival rate after five years.

Sandie introduced Wendell Coleman, Volunteer Coordinator from the Woodrow Wilson Rehabilitation Organizations at the Center. Cerise Haas, Treasurer, presented him with a check representing the donation by the Guild and the shared profit from the ticket sales for the 2010 raffle quilt. Mr. Coleman thanked the Guild for their generosity and interest in the

Center. The money will go to provide services not covered by the State to students.

Show and tell included the new raffle quilt and was enjoyed by all.

Following a break, Augusta Cole gave a presentation on "Tricks, Tips, and Tidbits." She gave a workshop on Friday on the Curved Log Cabin; this afternoon there will be a workshop on "Snappy Scrappy Fat Quarters." We were all reminded why Augusta is one of our favorite teachers!

COMFORT PILLOWS/TOTES

We donated 25 pillows & totes to Augusta Health and 50 to Winchester in October. You donated 73 p/t at our October meeting! Great job!! We have a total of 107 on hand. So we are well on our way to the goal for the year of 350. You are encouraged to join us at the November service project when we will be making pillows & totes from kits. We will demonstrate the process of making them from kits. After you have made one, the second is much easier. We will provide kits and polyfil to finish the p/t, no cutting necessary. Each kit provides you with a handle, outside fabric and lining, outside pillow fabric, flannel backing and

2 pieces of soft batting. If you would like to sew, bring your machine with walking foot. Irons and ironing boards will be provided. Bring with you: thread (light, dark, neutral), needles, pins, scissors, and thimbles, if you use them. We will have extra supplies on hand. Come join us for an afternoon with friends and fellow quilters to work on a guild service project that is so appreciated by breast cancer patients. 
