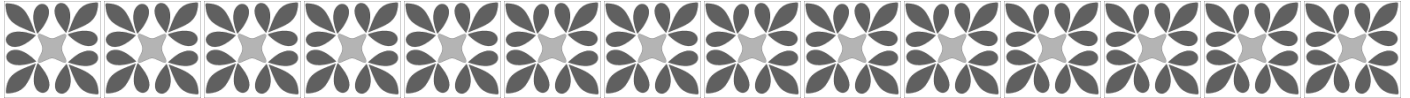

Thanks to Fran Miller's insight and hard work on March 18th, we were treated to a day filled with fun, information, and good fellowship as the members and invited guests of SVQG celebrated "National Quilting Day". Thank you to all of those who worked along with Fran to make this special day one to remember.

On March 19th it was a pleasure to meet the founder of **A Small Hand**, Ann McBroom. Ann gave us a look into the needs of young area families who are struggling to keep their infants and toddlers fed and clothed. Her organization, run entirely by volunteers, helps to fill the gap of food and supplies not covered by WICK and SNAP. These programs are of great help, but the supplies are not for the entire month. Providing quilts is only one way we are able to help A Small Hand. There is an ongoing need for formula, baby food, disposable diapers, lotions, shampoo, baby wipes, infant and toddler educational toys/books and gently used or new clothing. There will be a table set up at the April and May guild meetings for any members who wish to donate items listed. These will be delivered along with the completed quilts after our service project in May. Our May service project will focus on sewing and finishing quilts for **Wrap a Smile** (international) and **A Small Hand** (local).

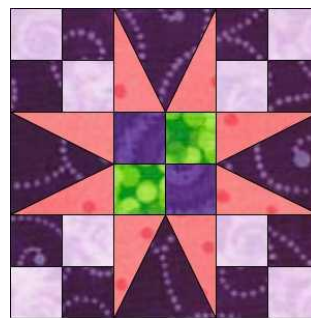

PROGRAMS

National Quilting Day is history for another year but our guild can be proud that we recognized and celebrated the day on Friday, March 18 by gathering for a Quilter's Day. The program took a different approach by focusing on the quilter rather than just quilting. A fun activity was to guess how many spools we used

as guild members in the last seven months. Carolyn brought a huge bin of 710 spools that we collected and Leslie Bulken had the closest guess, winning the prize. The Spool Challenge ended the next day at the guild meeting when Bev London's name was drawn as the winner of another prize. Gae Baker was the runner-up.

Ann McBroom was speaker at the March guild meeting and her message touched our hearts. A Small Hand is an emergency food pantry for babies and toddlers in need in Shenandoah County. They also provide other basic items young children need for a healthy start in life. Our guild has provided quilts in the past and gave Ann 12 more quilts following her presentation. We received the following note of thanks from her.

Thank you all for everything. Saturday was an amazing day for A Small Hand, starting with SVQG and ending late Saturday night with a music fundraiser. The music was so loud it was almost impossible to talk, but the young people did us proud!

I placed your quilts around our church sanctuary on Sunday morning, and our congregation loved them.

We are giving priority for the quilts to families with ill babies and those in special need. We have a little baby going to UVA to have a section of his skull removed to release pressure on the growing brain. I am delivering his quilt tomorrow, he is scheduled for surgery Friday. We have some little twins – he was born with a collapsed lung, she very tiny. The boy is going to UVA soon for follow-up. A fourth quilt will go to a little girl – 9 months old. She was born with a tumor in her lower back area. She has had 4 surgeries and 6 rounds of chemo. She is a fighter, and a smiler. She needs changing very frequently. She is part of a loving family who has been wiped-out financially by her medical needs, and the time spent away from home. But they will do everything they can to secure her future.

We will not hoard the quilts – but they are very special.

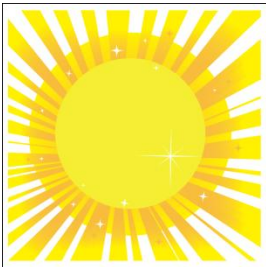

Take Time to **Laugh** - it is the music of the soul

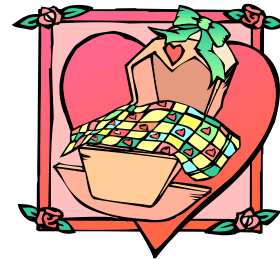
Take Time to **Listen** - it is the pathway to understanding

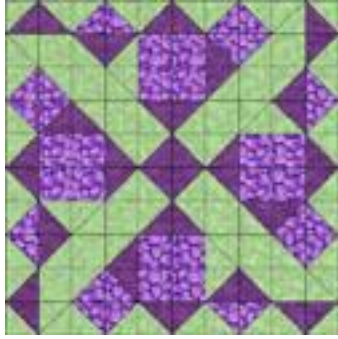

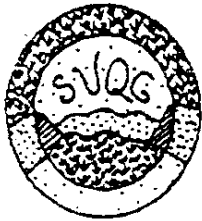
