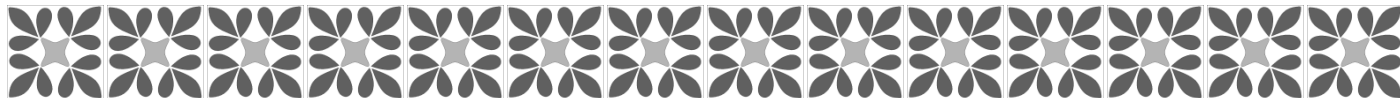

Announcements:

- The Rockbridge Regional Quilt Guild will be having their quilt show at the Lexington Horse Show Exhibit Hall. See the brochures at the membership table for more information.
- On the bulletin board you will see a flyer for the American Sewing Guild. This is a nationwide organization. If any are interested in workshops, special events, community service sewing and education that may complement your quilting or sewing interests, go to the national website at www.asg.org or www.asgrichmond.netfirms.com and see what this organization has to offer.
- The Virginia Quilt Museum has a contest for the best small Christmas quilt, no larger than 6 inches by 6 inches (using any method).

The deadline for this is July 31, 2011. Visitors to the museum will vote on their favorite. The makers of the top three small Christmas quilts will win a gift certificate to the VQM shop. The quilts will then be sold in the shop to raise money for the museum.

Minutes from the June meeting were printed in the July Newsletter. A motion was made and seconded that they be approved as printed. The motion was carried.

The treasurer's report was given by Cerise Haas and approved to be filed for audit.

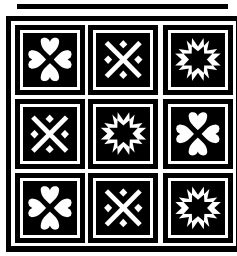

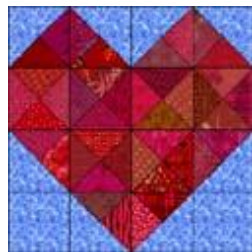

I'm going to ask that you list SIX UFOs in no particular order.

To start the challenge, your commitment will be two fat quarters. Bring them to the September meeting. *(Bring fat quarters that you LOVE—you may end up with ALL of them in the end!)*

In September, we're going to draw a number (1-6). The number that's drawn will be the project we'll be challenged to complete by our November meeting. That gives us two months to complete the chosen UFO.

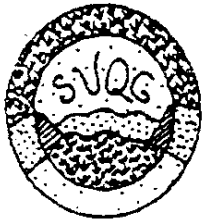
