

for your donations of food and toys. Informal gatherings like our Christmas parties and picnics provide us with opportunities to reach out and chat with members we hardly know and rarely spend time with at the general meetings.

Looking forward now to 2011!! January will find us cleaning and organizing our sewing spaces, gathering items to donate at the guild's auction on the 15th. It's always fun to see what we can contribute (and not miss!) and what we bring home to add to our collections. The auction, led by Denise Rudolph, will begin following the general meeting. A reminder: no magazines and batting scraps.

February 19th will find us hosting a guest speaker and attending an afternoon workshop. Gyleen Fitzgerald from Maryland will share with us her journey to finish found vintage quilts by adding her style, contemporary fabric, and unexpected color blending without compromising the original intent. She penned plausible stories in the form of letters to celebrate the original quilters in a book she wrote about this project, Quilts: Unfinished Stories with New Endings. The afternoon workshop, "Batik Interlocking Star Tessellations", will give us the opportunity to learn a mapping technique of using simple shapes to make an interlocking design that only looks complicated. (A sample is shown above.) We will be doing a wall hanging but if you like the technique it can easily be enlarged to a full




sized quilt. Sign-up sheets and supply list will be in the February newsletter.

Looking ahead—**March** is reserved for machine quilting instruction and practice. **April** is the month for the Education Committee, led by Molly Toth, to give us all a review of quilting techniques and supplies. **May** is Service month with emphasis on kid's quilts and **June** will focus on design, embellishments, and art in our quilts. **July** – It's a Mystery!! And in **August** we get to party again at a picnic.

We have a full agenda to look forward to and a wonderful group of fellow quilters to share the good times with—we are so very fortunate as a guild.

Sandie Hammel called the meeting to order and asked those members with cell phones to please turn them off or put them on “vibrate” so that they would not disturb the meeting. She read a

poem about what she was thankful for on this Saturday before Thanksgiving.

The minutes of the October meeting were approved as printed in the November/December Newsletter. The treasurer's report was given and is included in the secretary's minute book. (This is also available in the Members Only section on the website: www.svqg.org.)

PROGRAM: Fran Miller announced that there would be demonstrations on making the pillows and tote bags that will be made during the afternoon. We will have the holiday party in December and she reminded everyone that this would be on the **second** Saturday in December. Members are invited to bring their favorite holiday side-dishes or dessert. There will be a contest for the best tee shirt, sweater, and sweatshirt. She encouraged everyone to bring canned goods for the local food pantries. The party will be at the Bridgewater Town Hall.

The January meeting will be the auction. Please do not bring magazines, but books are fine. She suggested making the auction more interesting by putting “offerings” together in a decorated manner. In February we will spend the afternoon on tessellations. The focus in March will be on machine quilting with Barbara Cline. She encouraged everyone to finish the survey that was in the Newsletter; this will allow the guild to set up some new activities.

NEWSLETTER: The last Newsletter covered November and December. The January Newsletter has a deadline of December 17th.

LIBRARY: Books that are not being circulated are for sale during the break at \$2.00 apiece. Kathy Christy showed the results of the classes she took in Houston.

VIRGINIA QUILT MUSEUM: Josephine Millett announced that they have a sale table here today and everyone can shop for items from the VQM shop. Our speaker today will be Judith Shuey, Director of the VQM.

SERVICE: Sue Jones gave a report on the history of the breast cancer pillows and totes project. We have donated 849 pillows and totes since the project was begun in 2004. She handed out written directions and suggested using a walking foot on your machine when sewing them.

Sandie shared a letter received from someone in Colorado who is researching quilts made in this area by someone with the family name of Blosser. If you know of someone with this family name who made quilts, contact Sandie for information on reaching the letter writer.

Show and Tell was wonderful and enjoyed by all.

Following the break our speaker, Judith Shuey, showed some of the quilts in the museum's collection and gave a brief history of the museum.

The meeting was adjourned and a work session making totes and pillows followed a delicious soup luncheon.


