October 20, 2012
Meeting Minutes

The meeting was called to order by President Lori Abbott-Herrick, who welcomed everyone. Marcia Hill introduced her guest, Babe Williams, who was presented with a friendship square and a ticket to the Virginia Quilt Museum. Lori announced that she has received two small quilts to be sent to our sister guild, Hope, in Russia. Members are encouraged to make more quilts and to bring them to the November meeting. Lori welcomed Sandie back and announced that the deadline for November's Newsletter is October 26th. She thanked Dianne Reasons and Roberta Patterson for their hard work updating the website. The guild's treasurer's report, the quilt show report, and the 2012-13 budget are available on the website in the "members only" section.

The minutes of the September meeting were approved as printed in the newsletter with the following amendments:

President's announcements:

"The brochure for the Shenandoah Valley *Quilt Trail* will be available at the table during the break."

Regarding the Russian sister guild. "This will be made easier if we can get them before December when they can be taken by the daughter of one of their members who lives in *Broadway* and will be going to Russia for the holidays."

Quilt Show report: "The profit for the Quilt Show was \$2,230.04. The profit for the raffle quilt was \$721.50, following a donation to Skyline Literacy of \$1,500."

Service report: "Some quilts will need to be made by the November meeting."

Cerise Haas gave the treasurer's report, which was filed for audit.

Old Business

The 2012-13 budget has been approved by the Board and is posted on the SVQG website in the "members only" section. If members have any questions, they should contact Lori Abbott-Herrick.

Reports

Service: Service projects will be the focus for the November meeting. Representatives of the hospice organizations serving the patients who receive SVQG quilts and Samantha dolls will be at the meeting. Members are asked to bring any completed dolls and hospice quilts in November. Please get labels from Denise to put on your quilts and dolls and attach them beforehand.

Also during the afternoon service workshop in November, members will work on red, white and blue hospice quilts for veterans. Members are asked to bring red and blue

four patch blocks to the November meeting and their sewing machines, thread and sewing tools for the afternoon session. The four patch pattern is available on the website. In addition, volunteers are needed to machine quilt several hospice quilt tops.

The guild sent a check for \$100 to the Dan River Baptist Church in Danville, Va. to help cover expenses for the Samantha doll project. Denise read a thank you note from that organization as well as a thank you note from a family who received a quilt through the Augusta Medical Center hospice program.

Programs: Connie Broy announced that the Christmas party will be the second Saturday of December at 9:30 a.m. in the Sunnyside meeting room. Members are asked to bring brunch casseroles and side dishes, but no desserts please. She asked those who made bags with Diane Norman at the September meeting to stand and show them.

UFO #1 is due at the November meeting. Anyone wishing to sign up for the UFO challenge was asked to do so at the October meeting and to turn in their two fat quarters.

Library: Kathy Christy will be leaving for Houston on October 22nd. Please e-mail her any suggestions about book topics or titles.

Raffle Quilt: All Sues and Bills have been returned, but more piano key segments are needed for the borders. If you have questions, contact Mary Carlton.

Ways and Means: There are two raffle "trick or treat" buckets available. DVDs of previous years' quilt shows (2010 and earlier) are available for \$2.50 each. Next month members can purchase 15 seconds of 'bragging time' for \$1 and make their announcement(s) during show and tell.

FYI ANNOUNCEMENTS –

For all of the new quilters out there –

If you have questions on a quilt that you are working on contact our President Lori Abbott-Herrick and she will introduce you to one of our members who can help you through your quilting problem. Many new quilters get frustrated when they come to a point on a new quilt that seems to stump them, but with so many experienced quilters in SVQG all you need to do is ask. Never give up and put a project in a drawer just to become a **UFO** (**Un**Finished **O**bject), just call on an experienced quilter for guidance or ask at one of the guild meetings.

Converting Yards to Inches -

$$1/8 = 4-1/2''$$

$$1/4 = 9''$$

$$1/3 = 12''$$

$$3/8 = 13-1/2''$$

$$1/2 = 18''$$

$$5/8 = 22-1/2''$$

$$2/3 = 24''$$

$$3/4 = 27''$$

$$7/8 = 31-1/2''$$

$$1 = 36''$$

Standard Cuts -

Fat

$$\text{Quarter} = 18'' \times 22''$$

Fat

$$\text{Eights} = 9'' \times 22''$$

Fat

$$\text{Sixteenth} = 4-1/2'' \times 22''$$

Samantha Doll Quilts -

$$\text{Doll Quilt} = 24'' \times 36''$$

$$\text{Child Quilt} = 36'' \times 45''$$

Did you know that when considering how much yardage you need for your quilt that you should factor in the possibility that your fabric can shrink up to 5%. So get a few extra inches to make up for the shrinkage. This will insure that you have enough fabric when cutting your pattern.

Standard Batting sizes:

Crib - 45" x 60"

Twin - 72" x 90"

Double - 81" x 96"

Queen - 90" x 08"

King - 120" x 120"

When making service or smaller quilts sometimes buying a king batting will be enough for three or four small quilts and save you money in the long run. Watch for those sales at your favorite places to shop. Piecing batting works just fine. It takes just a little extra time to evenly butt the pieces together and once quilted you never know that two or three smaller pieces were used.

As the weather cools and the holidays are fast approaching below is a recipe that feeds a crowd. Good for breakfast as a coffee cake or as a dessert anytime.

BAKE DAY CAKE WITH COFFEE FROSTING –

1 pkg. active dry yeast
¼ cup warm water (105 to 115 degrees)
¼ cup butter
1 cup sugar
2 eggs
¼ cup molasses
1 cup all-purpose flour
1 tsp. baking soda
1 tsp. ground nutmeg
1 tsp. ground cinnamon
½ tsp. salt
½ cup warm coffee (105 to 115 degrees)
½ cup raisins
½ cup chopped black walnuts or English walnuts

Coffee (see below) or Caramel (use your favorite recipe) Frosting

Grease and flour a 13x9x2 inch baking pan; set aside. Dissolve yeast in warm water. In a medium mixing bowl beat together butter and sugar until combined. Add eggs; beat well. Add molasses and yeast mixture, mixing on low speed until combined. Stir together flour, baking soda, nutmeg, cinnamon, and salt. Add to yeast mixture alternately with warm coffee. (Batter will be thin.) Stir in raisins and nuts. Pour into prepared pan; spread evenly. Bake in a 350 degree oven for 35 minutes or until toothpick inserted near center comes out clean. Cool on wire rack. Frost with Coffee Frosting. Makes 32 servings.

Coffee Frosting: In a medium mixing bowl beat together ¼ cup softened butter, 2 cups sifted powdered sugar, and a dash of salt until combined. Gradually add about 2 tablespoons hot coffee, beating until smooth and creamy. Makes about 1 cup frosting.
