Secretary Minutes from November 18, 2017 General Meeting

President Doreen Roadcap called the November meeting of the Shenandoah Valley Quilters Guild (SVQG) to order at 9:30 a.m. Thirty-nine members and guests were present. Roadcap welcomed all to the guild meeting. It was moved, seconded and carried (MSC) that the October SVQG minutes, as published in the newsletter, be approved.

The treasurer's report for October and November will be presented at the December meeting.

Reports:

Membership, John Hammel. The new membership year starts in January. Membership forms are available on the membership table and will be in the newsletter.

Ways and Means, Cerise Haas.

- The" Works in Progress" (WIP) program begins today. Members who want to participate should complete a form and submit it with two fat quarters to Cerise. A number for a project will be drawn each month. The first number is #4, due in January, 2018.
- There is a raffle today and tickets will be available through the break.

The Shenandoah Valley Quilters Guild is a great place to meet and greet old friends and make new friends; a place to relax and get away from the everyday problems; a place to share in the fellowship of good company

SVQG Mystery Quilt Challenge

At our November meeting, we kicked off a new mystery quilt! This is a quilt that is constructed step by step without knowledge of the final pattern. Everyone is encouraged to join in the fun! This is a scrappy quilt so it's a good chance to work on your stash. We are also attempting to arrange to have the designer of the pattern visit our guild for the final reveal. The introduction and step one were handed out at our meeting and are now posted on the website (svqg.org) under the "Challenges" tab. The website of the designer is included in the instructions. There will be five steps and assembly with one step introduced each month, November to April. In May, we will have a "reveal" to show the tops that have been created. We are hoping to have the creator of the pattern present at the May meeting. Full details of that visit are still in the works, but I will tell you that the creator is a "he" and he lives in the Midwest. More will be revealed at the November meeting. The final quilt will measure 70"x90" on completion. Written directions for each step will be handed out at the guild meetings each month and then posted on the web site. To get everyone started, here is a list of fabric requirements. You are encouraged to use your scraps. All yardage are approximate amounts and will exceed what is actually used, just to be on the safe side. The written instructions will have color pictures of the fabrics suggested for the quilt:

Bright, brilliant, royal blues: 1 to 1 1/4 yards

Light to medium blues (think baby blues): 1/2 to 7/8 yard.

Navy blue: 2 ½ to 2 7/8 yards

Yellows (all shades): $1 \frac{1}{2}$ to $1 \frac{7}{8}$ yards Reds (all shades): $1 \frac{3}{8}$ to $1 \frac{1}{2}$ yards

Light Neutrals: 2 to 2 ¼ yards One constant medium gray: ¾ yard

Two more hints: If you don't care for blue, the blue fabrics can be another color: purple, green – as long as it is different from the other color requirements but there MUST be three distinct shades of the alternate color that you choose. For example, if you choose green you will need light greens, bright brilliant greens and very dark greens in the amounts listed for the blue.

And Clue #3 uses the Tri-recs ruler. If you have one, it's time to find it. If not, we will figure out purchase and lending/borrowing options to share with you soon.

Mystery quilts are fun! Hope you all participate. Nina Jackson
