The ‘Best in Show’ voting will occur during the show by the public. Sandie thanked all of the members that posted fliers.

The 2018 SVQG Quilt Show Comes to Town:

Day One: Every volunteer and many of their family members made it all work like a well oiled machine. As we entered the front door of the building and came into the big almost empty room the Quilt Intake Committee headed by Kathy Christy started setting up in the back of the room to start accepting, organizing, numbering and stacking as members brought their quilts. Soon after that the back door opened and in came the volunteers headed by Denise Rudolph who had picked up the quilt racks that Fran Miller so graciously stores for our guild. Then additional volunteers started filtering in moving tables that were stacked on one side of the wall and putting the boutique, welcome/raffle and demonstration tables in place. The correct numbers of chairs were placed next; all the while the racks were being assembled. Next in came Josephine Millett and helpers to set up the boutique. John Hammel made sure that all signs were hung or placed in the correct areas. Sandie Hammel and volunteers put together the Welcome/Raffle Sales table while John Hammel and volunteers made sure that the 2018 SVQG Raffle Quilt was hung. As quilts started being hung next came the vendors from Ragtime Fabrics and Patchwork Plus. Each of the vendors had their helpers putting together their spaces. Next volunteers led by Denise went to the stage area to display the 313 hospice quilts, pillows and totes, and pillowcases that are to be distributed at the end of the show on Saturday. Seeing that many quilts in one display was incredible. The volunteers all knew where to be and who was to do what because of the incredible organizational skills of Cindy Holland. By 2:30 all the quilts were hung and Cheryl Hawes started taking the photos of the quilt show as Barbara Johnson wrote the descriptions. After 4:00 off went the ladies to work on the CDs. The work on these lasted well into the wee hours of the morning so that the CDs were ready for sale by Saturday morning.

From 5:00 to 6:00 there was a members and guest reception where members chose the best in each category and ribbons were hung before we left the building at 6:30.

Day Two: Starting before 8:30 Denise Rudolph was out putting signs along the roadway to direct folks into the show. The Food Truck was in place, volunteers were going to their stations for the opening of the show at 9:00. Now let me say that I have done many, many craft and gift shows over the years and the first hour is just not busy. I had told some to expect a slow start the first hour. Well, that just did not happen. Starting just after 9:00 people started streaming through the doors and by 9:15 each and every aisle was filled with those enjoying our show. The crowds did not let up until about 4:30 with some still coming in until 15 minutes before the show ended. We had two areas where chairs were clustered so those who needed a sit break could spend some time. A great meet and greet your neighbors area, there was laughter throughout the room, shoppers were busy at the boutique or watching the demonstration, visitors were welcomed by our wonderful and informative vendors who took time to introduce them to things that their shops offered and show how much fun sewing and quilting can be. Their booths were enjoyed by members and visitors alike. Visitors asked lots of questions of our white glove volunteers. The interaction from our visitors was incredible not to mention the inquiries from visitors about becoming a member of our guild. We had one visitor that became a member on Saturday. The doors closed at 5:00, all was done in reverse but much faster and by 6:00 we walked out of the empty room. 
SEP, 15 - Guild Picnic at Bridgewater Shelter. This guild tradition is a dish-to-pass, held in shelter #1.

the 4 top fabrics – if they all blend together too much the interleave design won't stand out.

Supplies

rotary cutter
rotary mat
rotary ruler
thread to match
Iron
Ironing pad
Neutral or gray thread
Pins
Scissors
Paper scissors
Sewing Machine with 1/4" foot

4 fat quarters–Select 4 fabrics that go well together for the top. There should be some contrast between

Cut before class:



Stack two fat quarters together and cut 45° diagonal strips, 4" wide.

yellow and green fabric

Dark and light value

blue and red fabric.



Medium and darker value

Sew before class

Sew the strip sets together. Notice you will be able to make four squares, two of each color way. You will only need one of each color. You may want to share with another person in the class or make two quilts. This was the easiest way for me to give you directions for this. If you want to do this some other method that is just fine.

19TH AND Early 20TH CENTURY LOCAL QUILTS from the VALLEY AND NEARBY AREAS

The exhibit features a collection of quilts from the J. Frank Holsinger family of Broadway, VA dating from 1892 and a number of smaller collections from other local residents. As part of the exhibit, a quilt, “*Shenandoah Spring*”, made and donated by Laura Lantz Roberts will be raffled off with the winner announced in September at the Museum’s Heritage Day celebration. The exhibit will run through October.

Beyond the Valley (based on the Valley Botanical) Curated by Doreen Johnson

Fly Me to the Moon Curated by Susanne Jones

Artists from eight countries have created 179 art quilts celebrating Man’s First Walk on the Moon. This multifaceted collection commemorates the iconic images from the news; recalls personal memories of July 20, 1969; honors all the Apollo Missions; recognizes all of the Apollo Astronauts; investigates scientific moon images; examines NASA’s cool tools; explains myths associated with the moon; defines moon idioms; replays the music inspired by the moon; visits pop culture icons; and makes us fall in love again under the romantic moon.

Treasures From the Vault: New Acquisitions Curated by Gloria Comstock

These quilts have been accessioned in 2017 and represent several areas of Virginia. Our mission is preserving Virginia Quilting Heritage. The viewer will be able to read about the history of each quilt and many have photographs of the quilt maker and/or family. It is equally important to recognize the caretakers of these quilts – without their loving care, we would not have these treasures.

Small Botanical Sentiments Curated by Doreen Johnson

The beautiful appliqué quilts of the Shenandoah Valley inspired this exhibit. Quilters were asked to create a small quilt that relates to their perspective of, or emotional sentiment to Esther’s quilt or any portion therein. Ranging in size from 14 to 24 inches, each quilt must be able to reference visually, and in print, its conception and identity to the original quilt.
