We also gave 22 crib-sized quilts to Mission Central, a children's clothes closet sponsored by the Methodist Church for Harrisonburg and Rockingham County.

After receiving information on local efforts to make and donate quilts to North Carolina flood victims, the BEEvers along with several other guild members sewed and donated over 100 blocks, and one queen size and two full size finished quilts.

We feel blessed that our time and sewing skills allow us to get together monthly for fun, food and fellowship while creating quilts for others.
