March 16, 2019

President Debbie Jungling called the March meeting of the Shenandoah Valley Quilters Guild (SVQG) to order.

There were 2 visitors present.

It was moved, seconded and carried that the February minutes, as published in the newsletter, be approved.

Reports:

Treasurer – Nina Jackson presented the Treasurer’s report.

Programs 2 – Josie Mott was introduced as the new Programs 2. She had been a member of several guilds in Tennessee.

Newsletter – Vicki Graham – The newsletter deadline is March 22nd.

Publicity – A volunteer is needed for publicity since Gail is moving to Texas. There is interest in expanding the guild’s presence on social media.

Programs – Cindy Holland had to cancel the March program since Bonnie Spoon was sick. She is hoping to reschedule. The April program will be Round Robin demonstrations. The June workshop with Pat Sloan will be Friday, June 21st and the meeting has been moved to Saturday, June 22nd.

Works-in-Progress – Cerise Haas – Project #3 is currently due and Project #6 will be due by the May meeting.

Northern Shenandoah Valley Quilt Show

The 2019 show will take place April 12, 13 and 14 at the Clark County Parks & Recreation Center (225 Al Smith Circle, Berryville VA). Times are April 12 & 13, 10 am – 5 pm and April 14, 11 am – 4 pm. The theme is “All Creatures Great & Small”. There is a \$7.00 donation to get in the door. From Harrisonburg take I-81 to Exit 315 (Rt. 7 East), Follow Rt. 7 East to first Berryville Exit, Exit on right, follow signs ¼ of a mile and it’s on the right.

Program: Round Robin Demonstrations:

Fabric Painting – Mary Judge

Mary will tell you about different types of acrylic fabric paint and how they are used. She’ll have materials on hand for you to try a technique of dry brushing fabric accents, as well as working with a stencil. She will have a list of material sources, if you would like to try fabric painting on your own.

Fabric Ink Printing – Sandie Hammel

Sandie will demonstrate printing a block with a gel pad with ink using jar lids to make Mandela ink blocks. She will also have examples of rust dying and reverse dying using bleach. She will provide informational handouts.

Derwent Inktense Pencils and Blocks – John Hammel

John will show you how to utilize Derwent Inktense Pencils and Blocks to enhance your quilts. He will have stabilized blocks for you to give it a try yourself! He will also provide handouts on how to create the art blocks.

Piped Binding – Linda Pulhe

How about a new binding technique to try! Linda will teach you how to make a piped binding. It really is not that difficult! But, it does give a unique look to your quilt.
