February 15, 2020

Jane Hicks presents Designing Contemporary Art Quilts <http://hicksart.com/Q/Quilts.htm>

Jane says she started designing 45 years ago making Barbie clothes. Her first quilt was in the 1970's and she began designing her own quilts in 2003. She uses black or deep blue with rainbow colored batiks to create contrast and make them really come alive. By adding curved lines and flowing free-motion stitching she adds movement to her designs. She will sometimes modify a traditional design with a new twist in color and at other times she uses the rainbow colors to just make a picture. You will enjoy viewing her many unique and breathtaking quilts.

April 17 – Quilting with Vintage Needlework Workshop from 10-4 (Cost \$ 35) Start with a dresser scarf or other piece of vintage linen and Shannon will teach you how to make it new again in a quilted project. It is a great way to honor the handwork of folks from the past.

April 18- Eclectic Mix Trunk Show Shannon's eclectic taste comes out clearly in her quilting. She uses a wide variety of techniques and materials and generally starts with what she has and goes from there. Her quilts include those inspired by children's artwork, those incorporating vintage needlework, art quilts, traditional, creative quilt labels...there is sure to be something to interest everyone.

Items need to be hand crafted: some ideas are quilted, sewn, wood work, painted, wearables, woven, needlework, pottery, jewelry, kits ... just to name a few. This is a good way to show all the talents within our guild.

An application with instructions for Boutique items can be picked up at the membership table during guild meetings for the next four months. Get your thinking caps on and make our boutique unique and well stocked. Items can be turned in at any time before or at set up during the quilt show.
