RECIPE FOR ZUCCHINI QUICHE WITH BACON AND HASH BROWN CRUST

Ingredients

Hash Brown Crust

- 3 cups refrigerated or frozen hash browns, thawed, patted dry
- 2 tbsp extra virgin olive oil
- 2 tbsp unsalted butter melted

Quiche Filling

- ½ lb bacon, cooked, crumbled
- 1 shallot, diced
- 1 medium zucchini
- ½ tsp salt
- ½ tsp black pepper
- ¼ cup all purpose flour
- ½ tsp baking powder
- ½ tsp salt
- 5 eggs, room temperature
- 1 cup plain Greek yogurt
- 3 cups shredded cheese, (Sharp Cheddar, Gruyere, Monterey Jack, Dubliner, Pepper Jack a combination of 2 or more works best)

Instructions

1. Grate the zucchini onto a kitchen towel and squeeze dry. Set aside.

Hash Brown Crust

- 1. Preheat oven to 400F. Coat a 9-inch pie plate with non-stick spray.
- 2. In medium bowl, combine, hash browns, olive oil, butter, salt, and pepper.
- 3. Press hash browns into the pie plate, forming a crust. It should go all the way up the sides.
- 4. Bake 20-25 minutes until the edges are golden brown.
- 5. Reduce oven temp to 350F.

Quiche Filling

- 1. Cook bacon in pan until crispy. Remove and crumble into small pieces.
- 2. Remove all but one tablespoon of the grease from the skillet. Add the diced shallots and heat until soft and translucent.
- 3. Add shredded zucchini. Season with salt and pepper. Cook on high 3-5 minutes.
- 4. Combine the flour, baking powder, and salt.
- 5. In a separate bowl, beat the eggs until nice and fluffy. Whisk in the Greek yogurt until smooth.
- 6. Add the grated cheese, flour mixture, bacon, and zucchini mixture and stir until combined.
- 7. Pour into crust, bake 35-40 min. until center is set, the top is puffed and golden brown and a toothpick comes out clean. Let stand 5 min., remove from pan and serve. May be eaten hot, room temp., or chilled.
