In April, we were treated to a presentation by Celeste Compion, a Canadian quilter from near Toronto. She shared her beautiful fabric, shewheshwe (pronounced sway-sway) from South Africa and talked about the history and technique of cotton fabric printing in England and Africa. The beautiful indigo printed fabrics that she shared were inspirational.

Celeste was born in South Africa into a family of creative seamstresses and knitters. Shweshwe is traditional, 100 percent cotton print that evokes many memories for her as a little girl in the fabric warehouses of Cape Town, South Africa shopping with her mother. It is an aromatic memory: the sweet starchy smell of sizing, used to protect shweshwe for its sea voyage from Manchester, England, to South Africa. The cotton for this traditional fabric came from colonial America and now much of it comes from India.

As I was watching and listening to Celeste, I was reminded about what a small world we live in, not just now with modern forms of transportation, but even in much earlier times. People and families moved from continent to continent, raw materials and finished products were shipped thousands of miles across oceans. Our roots run deep, not just in our local communities, but world-wide.
