Coming up in September we have Patricia Pepe. She is the inventor of the X-block tool and has developed many patterns using this tool. Her Friday workshop is called X-treme X-blocks. You will not be using a pattern in this workshop, but will be exploring design possibilities. You will make something, but the

design is up to you. The Saturday afternoon workshop is on the basics of using the X-block tool. The supply lists are the same for both workshops, but bring lots more fabric on Friday. Breast Cancer Pillows/Totes

There is a change in how we distribute Pillows/totes in the Augusta/ Staunton/ Waynesboro areas. I gave 8 pillows/totes to the Surgical Dept. at Augusta Health, in July. They will be distributing them as women have surgery. In August, I gave 30 pillows/totes to Meg Schrader, Navigator, Augusta Health, to be distributed to those who will be having surgery in our area. Harrisonburg and Winchester remain the same.

One thing I want to pass along to you is this: When I delivered the pillows/totes to Meg Schrader, (she being a breast cancer survivor), she said she got a wonderful "sunflower" pillow/totes from our guild and it was so deeply appreciated and heavily used, even to this day......she expressed her deep appreciation to our guild and is focused on giving each surgical patient a breast cancer pillow and tote. So, guild member, what you are doing is so appreciated and used by those who are going through this traumatic time.

As most of you remember, October is Breast Cancer Awareness month. I am issuing you a challenge: Make pillows/totes. For each pillow/tote you make, you will be able to put your name in for a prize--to be drawn at the Oct. guild meeting. You must present your pillow/totes to me, so that I can make sure your name is put in for the drawing. I'll have kits ready in September, or you may use your own fabrics.

SUPPLY LIST FOR X-BLOCK WORKSHOPS

The supply lists for both workshops are the same, but bring lots more fabric on Friday. This workshop will cover a variety of design possibilities using the X-block rotary cutting tool. Try to bring at least 1 medium-large print. Large prints and stripes work well. Some contrast is necessary in your fabrics, but it doesn't have to be strong. To check contrast, place fabrics next to each other and stand 10 feet away. If they blend together, you need higher contrast. If you bring boring fabrics, your quilt will be boring.

X-block rotary cutting tool. (will be available for purchase)
3 or 4 different fabrics, (Saturday), more on Friday approx. 1 yard each
Rotary cutter, mat and ruler
Sewing machine
Colored pencils
Several small zip-lock bags
Basic sewing supplies (thread, pins, scissors, etc)
Personal design wall (piece of flannel, batting, flannel backed tablecloth)

X-TREME X-BLOCKS with Patricia Pepe

Patricia Pepe is a quilter and teacher from California. She developed the X-Block cutting tool and many patterns using it. She is the owner of Quilt Queen Designs. With the X-Block cutting tool, you can create dozens of spectacular designs that look complex, but are quick and simple. This class explores many of the design possibilities using the X-Block tool.
